

Kid's Apron

This is a super easy and fun gift for kids. I bought a package of five dish towels for under \$10 and have made three kid aprons with them.

The graphic below shows you how. The trick is to let the pre-sewn selvages do much of *your* work.



Materials:

Standard size dish towel

2 yards sturdy grosgrain ribbon

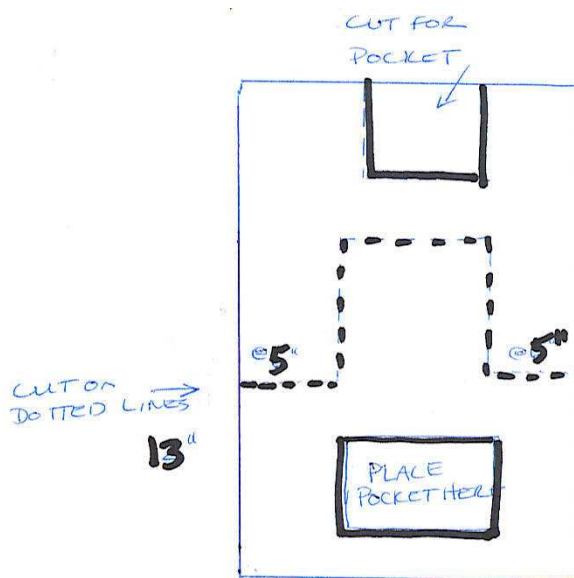
Cut the apron shape, making your first horizontal cut about 13" from the bottom edge of the towel. Cut 5 inches from either side, then cut up/vertical about 9 inches. This forms the bib.

Use a square cut from the upper portion of the towel to make a pocket, as shown, turning raw edges under before applying

Turn raw edges of bib and sides under and top stitch. Take two grosgrain ribbons and top stitch on at waist.

Use two additional ribbons to form shoulder straps.

Watch the little one in your life smile when you present the gift. (I tucked Crayons into the pocket for one little girl I gave an apron to!)



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
